Our efforts have not only enriched the lives of thousands of persons with disabilities in Singapore but have also led to the emergence of champions, such as 7-time Paralympic gold medallist Yip Pin Xiu and Singapore's first silver medallist in Boccia, Jeralyn Tan.

Annex A

The Champions Who Inspire a Nation: The Story of Yip Pin Xiu & Jeralyn Tan



Living with Charcot-Marie-Tooth syndrome, a nerve condition which deteriorates muscle strength and sensation, Pin Xiu spent much of her childhood at the poolside, watching her brothers play. There was once when Pin Xiu thought - all wheelchair users seemed to be selling tissue paper; was that what she was going to grow up to do?

When she turned five, Pin Xiu asked to join her brothers and discovered something extraordinary - in the pool, she was free. That freedom sparked a lifelong passion and a sporting career that would later rewrite Singapore's history.

At 12 years old, Pin Xiu was spotted by a volunteer of the Singapore Disability Sports Council (SDSC) and invited to join its training programme. From then, the SDSC has stood by her side with coaching, training and competition support that helped her grow from a young swimmer into a 7-time Paralympic Gold medallist and 8-time World Champion. Today, Pin Xiu serves on SDSC's Board, giving back to the very community that nurtured her. Her story is a reminder that with opportunity and support, lives can be transformed.

That same spirit of resilience is embodied by Jeralyn Tan. Diagnosed with spastic quadriplegia, the most severe form of cerebral palsy, Jeralyn received her education at the Cerebral Palsy Alliance Singapore School - a founding member of the SDSC - and loved making crafts. It was a future she was preparing for - perhaps selling her crafts to empathetic people.



Little did Jeralyn know when she started playing Boccia in her school, that she would one day be able to qualify for the highest level of competition - the Paralympic Games, equivalent of the Olympic Games for athletes with disabilities.

For almost 20 years, Jeralyn trained in a sport she loved. From hardly being able to bend her back to now being able to take steady aim of her shots with a strong core, Jeralyn's perseverance bore fruit not only for her physical health. In 2024, Jeralyn won Singapore's first ever Paralympic medal in boccia.

Besides training, Jeralyn now inspires others as a mentor and facilitator in SDSC's WeHeartBoccia workshops, helping to spread the benefits of the sport to seniors at active ageing centres, nursing homes, and to school students.

Both Pin Xiu and Jeralyn exemplify what happens when talent meets opportunity and when a community believes in ability over limitation. Their stories are testaments to how sport, with the right support, can change lives and inspire a better Singapore.

Jovin Tan: From Enduring Family Abuse to Sailing to the Top of the World



Born with cerebral palsy, Jovin's pursuit in sailing was an attempt to get away from his abusive father, who was snide about his disability. So despite his fear of water - which gave him spasms, Jovin overcame his phobia so that he could get out of the house. With SDSC's support for transport and training, Jovin clinched a spot in the national sailing team and went on to compete internationally, even at the Paralympic Games. His achievements helped Jovin's family to see him in a different light, and his sister, Gina, who had initially been influenced by their father and looked down on Jovin, even became his volunteer.

Yet, when sailing was dropped from the Paralympics in 2016, Jovin faced an unthinkable question: what was to come next?

Rather than step away, Jovin chose to begin again. With SDSC's support, he turned to boccia - a precision sport that demanded a different level of patience, control and set of skills. But with determination, Jovin embraced the challenge. His dedication and sharp mind honed from sailing helped him to excel in a short period of time, and Jovin is now once again competing internationally.



That same drive is mirrored in Muhammad Hariz bin Sanusi, an 11-year-old who lives with spina bifida. Watching his classmates take part in swimming lessons once felt out of reach - until he joined SDSC's SwimTogether programme, which reached out to mainstream schools to support students with disabilities in learning to swim alongside their non-disabled peers.

Through inclusive coaching and adaptive techniques, Hariz has gained not just swimming skills but confidence and independence. He is the only member of his family who knows how to swim. "Since joining the programme, I've noticed my son is more active at home and has become physically fitter," shares his mother, Hadijah, proudly. "He loves swimming now and is looking forward to future local competitions - it's given him a new sense of freedom."

From seasoned athletes like Jovin to young swimmers like Hariz, SDSC continues to open doors for persons with disabilities to discover their potential and pursue their passions. Their stories are proof that with the right support, the will to compete - and to grow - never stops.
